

How to Get Started

1. Gather required documentation prior to scheduled appointment:
 - Driving Abstract (Driving Record from Sec. of State/DMV)
 - "Notice of Summary of Suspension" and/or "Law Enforcement Sworn Report" (the Circuit Clerk Office in county in which the DUI arrest occurred has a copy)
 - If a blood test was completed after the DUI arrest, locate the "Laboratory Report"
2. Bring above documentation with payment for the DUI Evaluation to The Prairie Center at 718 Killarney, Urbana. Complete paperwork and schedule the Evaluation appointment.
3. Complete the DUI Evaluation
4. Follow the recommendations in the DUI Evaluation

The Process

Have you or someone you care about been **arrested for a DUI** (driving under the influence of alcohol and/or other drugs)? If so, state law requires that you complete a DUI Evaluation and all evaluator recommendations before a judicial driving permit (JDP) or full reinstatement may be granted by the court. At that time sentencing can occur for the DUI offense and driving privileges may be granted by the Office of the Secretary of State.

Experienced, specially qualified evaluators at The Prairie Center conduct DUI Evaluations that include an interview, review of the defendant's driving history, chemical test results (blood alcohol content), and objective test score. The focus of the interview will address past and current alcohol and drug use. When the evaluation is completed, a classification and recommendations will be determined by the evaluator. This information will be given to the defendant to take to the Secretary of State for the driver's license hearing. Classification will be one of the following:

- Minimal Risk
- Moderate Risk
- Significant Risk
- High Risk

We Do It Right!

Licensed by the Illinois Department of Human Services, Division of Alcoholism and Substance Abuse, The Prairie Center conducts evaluations for the Court or the Office of the Secretary of State. The Prairie Center evaluators are specially certified in DUI Services and complete additional training annually.

Mandated paperwork is prepared correctly the first time. Our staff works with defendants and attorneys to provide the documentation required for the Court and the Secretary of State. Documentation may include:

- Alcohol & Drug Uniform Report (DUI Evaluation)
- Secretary of State Treatment Verification
- Continuing Care Status
- Chronological Use History
- Discharge Summary
- Aftercare Plan



Financial Expectations

It is the responsibility of the defendant to pay for the evaluation and to pay for any additional education and treatment that is recommended. The Prairie Center will provide services at a reduced fee to defendants who can prove their inability to pay the full cost in accordance with the established income guidelines of the State of Illinois.

Education & Treatment Services

The Prairie Center provides a wide variety of DUI services. The Risk Classification recommended in the evaluation will help determine which services meet an individual's needs.

Risk Education provides an orientation to DUI offenders regarding the impact of alcohol or other drug use on individual behavior and driving skills. A minimum of 10 hours total of classroom instruction in four sessions over a four week period are offered for those who are classified as Minimal, Moderate, or Significant Risk.

Outpatient Substance Abuse Treatment is necessary for those classified as Significant or High Risk. Treatment begins with a **Substance Abuse Assessment** to determine specifically which treatment services will best meet an individual's strengths and needs. Individualized treatment plans are developed with each client. When nearing completion of treatment, clinicians assist clients to develop a continuing care plan to help maintain recovery following treatment.
