Service Priorities

In compliance with Illinois Department of Human Services, Division of Alcoholism and Substance Abuse regulations, Prairie Center gives priority in its admission of patients for services to the following patients (unless such priority would violate State or Federal Law).

1. Pregnant injecting drug users.
2. Pregnant and postpartum women.
3. Injecting drug abusers (who are at high risk for HIV infection) and known HIV-infected persons.
4. Illinois Department of Children and Family Services referrals; Persons eligible for Temporary Assistance to Needy Families (TANF) and other women and children; Department of Corrections (DOC) releasees who have completed a prison treatment program; Treatment Alternatives for Special Clients (TASC) referrals.

The Program

Residential Services of Prairie Center Health Systems is a starting point on the Path to Recovery. Residential In-Patient is located in the downtown area of Champaign, Illinois, at 122 W. Hill Street, easily accessible by interstate. **Our 24 Hour Contact Line is (217) 356-7576.**

Serving adults, 18 years of age and over, our Residential presents a safe, supportive environment where you can begin your recovery journey. The Program offers a variable stay (See Options) with separate accommodations for men and women and a structured daily schedule. Placement is based on an individual substance abuse assessment. Treatment Plans are strength based and designed to meet your needs and challenges. Includes individual and group counseling, education sessions, family groups, relapse prevention and discharge planning.

Research/Evidenced-Based curriculums and therapeutic methods derived from Hazelden, Texas Christian University, Claudia Black, Terance Gorski and Lisa Najivits are the foundation of our treatment program.

Supportive Services include an initial physical exam, assistance with obtaining medications, hospital transportation, HIV testing and education, nutritional education, recreational and leisure time activities, transportation to support groups and to related services

Adult Substance Abuse Residential Services

Prairie Center's residential treatment program is committed to providing you with the best addictions treatment possible. Our services are based on the philosophy that addiction to alcohol and other drugs is a chronic, relapsing, and life threatening disease. It impacts an individual physically, mentally, socially and spiritually and often has devastating effects on the family.

We believe that when you choose to enter residential treatment, you have made an important decision to choose a life of recovery from addiction and change your lifestyle for the better. Through abstinence, participation in mutual support groups and 12 Step programs, a personal commitment to change and honesty with yourself and others, recovery can become a lasting reality for you.

Our treatment professionals meet you where you are in the change process. Motivational interventions, evidence based practices, family education, and mutual support are the cornerstones that challenge each person to learn and apply the necessary skills to better manage their addiction and establish ongoing recovery. Our supportive structured environment fosters resiliency and individual responsibility.

The length of stay in residential treatment will vary based on a thorough assessment of your individual needs and strengths. Room, meals, transportation and medical services are also provided. The residential portion of your treatment is only a small part of your whole recovery process. Each individual will have developed a solid relapse prevention plan and receive a prescribed aftercare program.
